The rain not only caused 2 games to be cancelled, but it also blocked a few of our early training sessions, which wasn't ideal given our need to get some basic skills under our belts however, the first few games were enjoyed both the group as a whole and each player showed their own set of skills early on.

Our results as the new kids in town were; a great first game draw against Kurnell, followed by a loss in our second game to Gymea, then our inaugural win in game 3 against Engadine before losing game 4 to Gymea by one try on the bell and then losing game 5 soundly to De La Salle.

By this stage, Mikaela had shown that she was one of our star performers and Indy our important dummy half in attack. I don't believe we played any other girls by this stage and these two had proven to be invaluable.

Jake and Johnny starred in defence with their tag skills showing out game after game, Taj scored most times he had the ball in hand, his size and speed just too much for most sides, Max bamboozled defenders with his hop and skip in attack, Jack became our all-round superstar in both attack and defence, scoring some great tries and saving just as many with his cover defence while Leo carried the ball up with focus and intent.

By this stage, we were having fun, looking forward to the following weeks training and slowly improving our skills. I must say though that Friday training had its challenges concentration wise after a full week of school and reeling them in was a task at times, but happy they were to run-a-muck.

THE RE-GRADE & JUNE - AUGUST.

Merging two teams this year gave us a massive boost to the Coaching unit, especially with Clint's technical coaching drills. Unfortunately we needed a bigger boat to train on due to the rain and disruption. Whilst we started with a full roster, there were a few (I assume) drownings and competition from the grass ballet for talent was fierce. The result was a tight unit with much more game time and I like to think a fitter group (excluding the coaching unit) with great game experience and technical improvement! The animals we allowed onto the Arc this season were as follows:

William Ciraldo – hard to believe he started in grass ballet, he wasn't going to survive in that habitat especially since he complete discarded his shell this season. William "the animal" turned up from day 1 ready to go! He's still hard to classify, part panther – part wild dog, but we do know The Animal is quickly adapting and learning... A new attacking game developed in the off season which threatens to see him switch to fullback. His meters gained under pressure and foot work in attack were an unexpected new skill and his defense improved further to a level that made it venomous. Speaking volumes about his ability was an outstanding game average of making 2.64 opposition players cry per game – that's officially the club record! (Sorry Kim, stats don't lie).

Harry Golar – Surprisingly, Harry didn't get any smaller over the off season! This season he turned up and had some cracking games, but even on the off days this season he put in for the team which is outstanding. Harry's attitude made him the least "yelled at" (to pay attention and stop kicking the balls) at training as well which the coaching unit appreciates. Last year Harry consistently made big meters in attack, but this year opposition teams had a lot more confidence they could take him down... until they couldn't! Running like a Rhino carrying a troop of gorillas on his back he was more likely to trip over a fallen body than get tackled. Tackling him front on even proved too difficult for Carter at training sometimes with his horns impinging nightmares on opposition players.

Lachlan Boyle – is a naturalized species to the Australian wilderness (Irish heritage) and initially his parents enrolled him in grass ballet, not realizing the synergy between the more physical Irish past times of Curling and Rugby Union with Rugby League. Being slightly shorter in stature he developed the attributes of a Wallaby with raw speed and agility allowing him to get on the outside and make serious gains, sometimes unfortunately on the wrong side of the touch line.... He is a natural ball runner and did eventually learn to take a tackle (not head for glory) which will set him up for next season. Especially for his first season his bravery in defense couldn't go unnoticed, technique will come later. There is no doubt he will continue to improve and develop from Wallaby to Kangaroo. It was also fascinating to learn some new words (I assume in Gaelic?!?) from his mum on the sideline!

Ashton Sheridan - always wants a run and he's looked hard at the trigonometry to work out running through the middle is the fastest way to the try line. Given he's built more like an outside back, teams think this will be simple tackling practice, but it turns out he's harder to tackle than a wombat, he doesn't step or slip through, he just fights through and doesn't give up. He can't be classified as a wombat with his build, so we think he's a huntsman spider – all arms and legs and very fast! Once into space he could stretch out and run away without risk of a covering tackle. Ashton got technically better in defense this year and was always trying his best and competing which is hard to teach and a great attribute for next year.

Bohdi Crothers - didn't play like an animal at all but is extremely important in the wet on any Arc. If you're feeding carnivores, you need a butcher and Bohdi was always there to carve up the opposition. This ability wasn't limited to attack, his edge defense which sliced attackers in half with excellent technique was always on show, in cover he didn't mind the occasional decapitation either. When playing first receiver his running ability was really on show especially if the team wasn't going forward the Butcher was always there on tackle 3 to cut through and make valuable meters. His natural agility and running stye would find space in broken play or he would use late footwork to fool defenders. The Butcher was extremely entertaining to watch on the sideline, his technical skill and football brain will only become more valuable in the older age groups.

Maximus Johnston – was always backing up and played most of the season at hooker (because everyone else refused to play there). Whilst quiet on the field he was always the first one running in on push and shoves or pushing tacklers off his mates. When he runs the ball, he doesn't like to waste energy running around when he can rely on a palm and strength to make meters through the middle. This aggression and love to run through traffic is true Cassowary behavior. Just like the Cassowary we found his eyesight did hold him back, but our trainer (Lindsay) got him onto contact lenses, and he ditched the old googles. With sight restored we saw a massive improvement and reignition of his defensive ability late in the season. Seeing like an eagle now, can't wait for next season!

Owen Aubrey - has an older brother and plays like his older brother never wants him to win. This really shows through when a rare missed a tackle clearly hurts more than any physical damage. Luckly, he also has the technique to back up the bravery but was still far and away the toughest player on the field. There was always chat and snarling coming from him on the field and we realized we had our own Tasmanian Devil! Owen can also run and ball play in the halves and was the best communicator and football brain on the field. The Tazzie Devil has real potential to change the game and rattle the attack of the opposition. His skills will only become more and more apparent in the older age groups where size and speed level out and brains, technique and bravery show through.

Reef Franks -constantly looking for contact in defense or attack and never backs down. He just continues to look for the ball and wants to run all game straight up the middle. He did have a period of running sideways, but this was corrected and gave him an opportunity to work on other ways through like a hit and spin and his very handy offloads. Reef is an absolute work horse, still more of a colt, not fully realizing how big he is and the impact his hit ups have in intimidation of the attack. Another player to improve technically hugely in defense he doesn't get may players wanting to run straight at him, when he does he stops them. Reefs courage will see him continue to do well in older age groups along with his determination and work ethic.

Carter Karauria-Henry is the happiest and most courteous player I've seen inflict that much damage on an opposition. This season Carter couldn't be pigeonholed due to his size, just like a blue heeler, he looks happy and calm, but can run all day and chases and bites Bulls for fun! He started the season using size and speed to score tries again, but there was a hidden skill set being a genuine ball player trapped in a props body. Still under development, these skills will see him go far in Footy. Another player who has clearly needed to learn to tackle older brothers, defense was never a concern, however his technique and technical ability really picked up over the season. Next year with players around him speeding up there is a real opportunity with his skill level to play in the halves.


